Fusion of Concert Colors Guidelines

Project Description: Each year FAME selects an orchestral work inspired by the year's multicultural focus. Children listen to the selected music and then create their own original artwork inspired by the music. The artwork is then turned into posters and specially chosen selections are displayed at an art gallery at the University of St. Francis. At the FAME Festival, during the Celebration of Youth Concert, the Fort Wayne Philharmonic performs the music that inspired the children's art pieces, while a giant slideshow displays the *Fusion of Concert Colors* masterpieces. Children that participated in *Fusion* are special guests at the Celebration of Youth Concert.

Fusion of Concert Colors Guidelines

- Familiarize your students with the music. The music and/or art teacher should take some time with the students to listen and discuss the orchestration.
- Discuss the difference similarities and differences between musical composition and visual composition. *For example, in music there is generally a dominant melody which is repeated throughout the piece, sometimes directly and sometimes in a variation. In a visual art piece, it is important to develop a theme either using shapes, colors, or lines then to repeat and vary that theme throughout the entire composition. Both musical and visual compositions are balanced.*
- After this discussion with your students, a brief demonstration on drawing or painting to the music can be given. It is important that the students know there is no "right" way to interpret the music. They are free to interpret the music however they feel best captures the music. Suggestions of putting musical notes or instruments in the picture should be avoided, but not forbidden.
- While presenting this project to your students, it is important they understand that the artwork selected to be showcased as posters is a subjective process. The selection panel is comprised of art and music specialists. The "winner" is merely the selected piece that caught the eye of the panel most.
- Several art periods may be spent with each class working on their Fusion masterpieces; one to listen to the music and plan your artwork and the second to refine and finish it.

The bottom line is for the children to relate music to art and enjoy creating!

Fusion of Concert Colors Guidelines

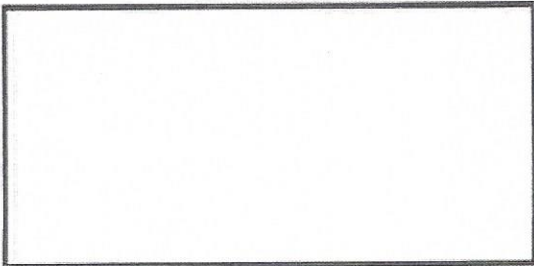
RULES

1. **All art work must be 12" x 18" or 18" x 12"**
2. **Students (or teachers) may decide to work with a horizontal or vertical layout**
3. **Each art piece submitted must have a completed entry form attached to the back of the artwork. This is absolutely necessary for identification. A guide for the "Artwork Back Label" is attached at the end of this packet. FAME will create the artwork name tag from this information. ***
4. **Markers, watercolors, tempa, acrylics, cut paper, pencil, and/or ink are the suggested medium.**
5. **Artwork may not be laminated.**
6. **All entries must be flat.**
7. **Please attach velcro (hook side up) on the back of all submissions. This is how the art work will be attached to the art board panels.**
8. **Each school may enter a total of 10 art work submissions, k-8th**
9. **All art work must be delivered to the FAME office by December 10th, 2021.**
10. **All artwork will be available for the pick up after the Teacher's Meeting in September.**

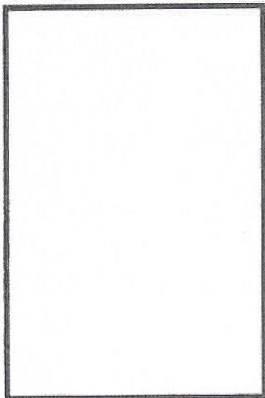

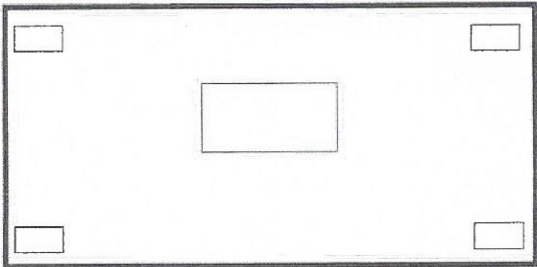

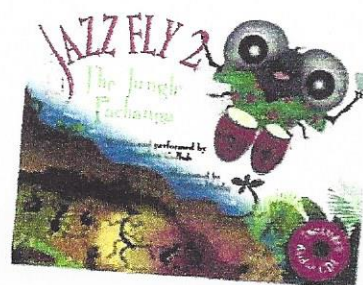
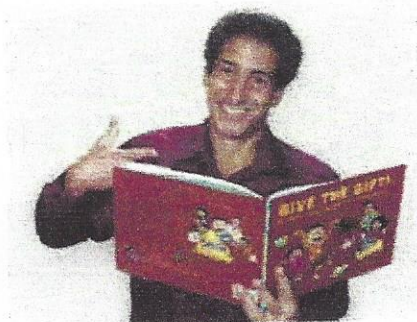
VISITING ARTIST BIO

Matthew Gollub is a multi-talented children's author and speaker. He has produced 20 picture books, which have garnered dozens of national awards and distinctions. His movin', groovin' Jazz Fly books with audio (including Jazz Fly 3: The Caribbean Sea) feature his narrations set to jazz music. Other popular books he's written take place in Mexico and Japan where he has also lived.

A dynamic drummer and bilingual (English / Spanish) presenter, he has performed at over 1,000 elementary schools, across the U.S. and abroad, inspiring students and families to read for fun. He speaks English, Spanish, Japanese and "jazz." (He even learned a bit of French for Jazz Fly 3!) Speaking different languages helps him connect with diverse audiences—and with the illustrators and musicians with whom he collaborates on his children's books about jazz.

"Language, rhythm, color, life!" is his philosophy that guides his creative work. When he's not publishing books or delivering live talks, he loves reading, traveling, jazz drumming and sports. "Chasing bouncing balls" could be his mantra when playing tennis and basketball!

He lives with his family in Northern California, about an hour north of the Golden Gate Bridge.



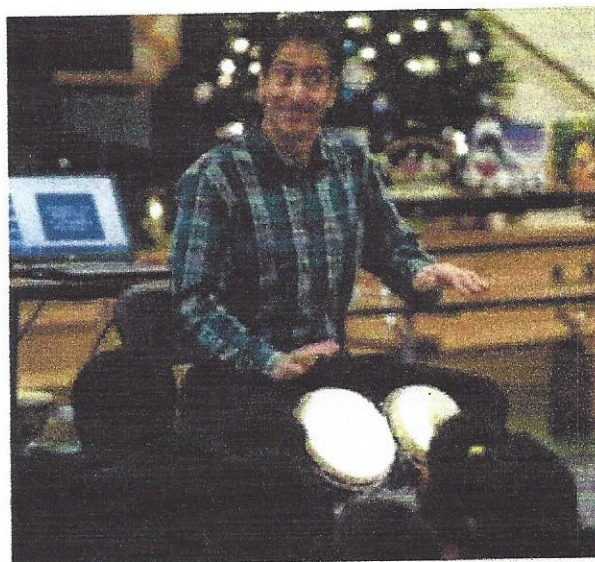

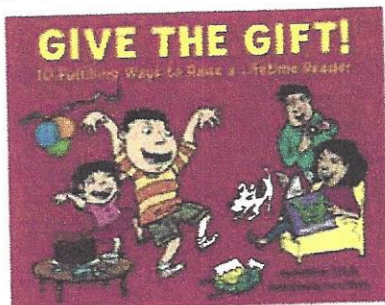

FAME, the Foundation for Art and Music in Education, was founded in 1986 with the belief that elementary and middle school students need special opportunities outside of school to **create, exhibit, and perform** works of art. What started as the FAME Festival in 1987 is now an acclaimed year-round arts education program for children. From the first festival in March 1987, FAME has been the largest single event at the Grand Wayne Center. After a cancelled festival due to COVID-19 and a virtual festival last year, we are so happy to be back in person!

This year, FAME is celebrating the 35th FAME Festival with "Jazz Age in North America!"

If this is your first or 35th time participating in the FAME Festival...we are so glad you're here!

Here's a little taste of what to expect at this year's FAME Festival:

At **The Imaginarium**, festival attendees can create and take home their own masterpieces! With over 10 theme related projects, attendees can get their hands dirty and creativity soaring! The Imaginarium is located in the center of the Main Hall.

FAME's **Scavenger Hunt** encourages children to partake in everything the FAME Festival has to offer...in a scavenger hunt form! This popular event is always well attended, well loved, and of course...there are prizes!

The FAME Festival's main attraction is our student's art. 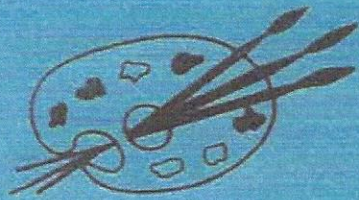

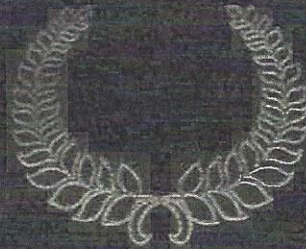

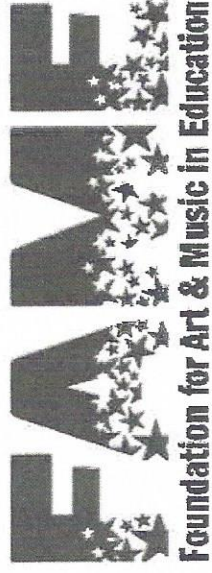
