#### WABASH COMMUNITY BAND



The Stage Band from Wabash Community Band will lead a workshop and share the stage with students from area high school stage bands who are invited to play along and learn some tips for various styles and techniques in playing jazz, popular and swing band music. The workshop will be on the Ford Theater stage from 1:30 to 2:30. The adults and students will then perform as part of the Spotlight Closing Concert at 3:00 in the theater.

Wabash Community Band became part of the programming of Living Well Winchester Senior Center in 2018. The band practices at Winchester Center, 239 Bond Street in Wabash on Monday evenings , depending on their concert schedule. The band is open to anyone out of high school with their own instrument. Students participate by special invitation. Band members come from four counties. The band was established by Art Conner, who was the Band Director at Wabash High School in 1992 at the time of the band's organization. Bob Urbani and Lindsay Knee are the directors of the Community Band at the present time, assisted by Jim Emrick, Jeff Evans, and Emily Rodeck. The Stage Band is coordinated by Ron Withers and Bob Brown.





#### ART WORKSHOPS

#### JEANIE COOPER

Jeanie Cooper will teach students a workshop in which they will make a Martisor good luck charm on a red and white cord, a tradition from Romania and other Balkan countries. Martisor is an old tradition celebrated all over Romania every year on March 1. The name Martisor is a diminutive of March (Martie in Romanian). It is the traditional celebration of the beginning of spring. It is believed that a person who wears a red and white string necklace with a martisor image would enjoy a prosperous and healthy year. Our participants will make the martisor on a shorter red and white cord instead of a necklace.

Jeanie's sessions will be in the Crystal Room at 9:30, 10:30, 11:30, 1:30 and 2:15. They will last approximately 30 minutes. Participants should plan to be in the room by the time the workshop starts to receive instructions and to learn about the history of the project.

Jeanie is well-known in the Wabash area because of her work with many student art experiences in the community. For many years, she was responsible for maintaining the Best of the Best art program for talented, selected high school students from all of the high schools in Wabash County. Wabash High School was enriched by her art opportunities for students during library artist lecture programs during selected lunch times.

Since retiring from the high school, Jeanie has been a very active teacher in the Home School Art Program. She enjoys working with all ages of students. You can also find her helping her daughter, artist Candie Cooper, with her art workshops.

#### SUSAN STEWART

Local artist Susan Stewart will lead four 45-minute painting workshops to design Bosnian style 12 oz. premade papier mache' bowls. The designs will provide very colorful bowls that will be appealing to the eye. Participants are encouraged to be in the room by the starting time of the workshops that will begin at 9:00, 10:15, 12:15 and 1:45 in the Nixon Room at the foot of the stairway downstairs. Workshops are suggested for students who are 7 and older with a limit of 20 in each session.

Mrs. Stewart is well-known in the Wabash area as an artist using fused glass in many of her projects, including the Wabash County ornament from the Visit Wabash office for Christmas 2020. She likes many avenues of artistic expression, having been a professional photographer, a jewelry maker, a painter using various media. She currently teaches art at St. Bernard Elementary School and in the Home School Art classes.

#### DARCY DYSON

Greek design mini clay flowerpots will be the project in workshops with guest artist, Darcy Dyson. The pots will be colored with magic markers for the designs, including a Greek key border and various other decorations. Both students and adults would enjoy making this project that would be great for small plants or succulents. Participation will be limited to 25 in each session.

Starting times will be 9:15, 10:00, 11:00, 12:45, and 1:45 in the Haist Room on the main floor of the building.

Darcy is a graduate of Indiana Wesleyan University where she received her degree in Painting and Printmaking. Most of her career has been filled with painting murals and custom printing. One of her murals can be found outdoors on the Roann Community Building. She has been a guest teacher several times this school year with the Home School Art classes.

## ALL-DAY ACTIVITIES IMAGINARIUM (MAKE-IT, TAKE-IT)

This do-it-yourself area for younger students has always been a very popular part of the FAME Festival. Visit the downstairs area in the Skating Rink to see what projects are available for students to make and take. Projects will include an Olympic torch, a Victory Wreath (symbolic laurel wreath), a Knight mask, a Knight sword, and a Knight shield. Thanks to the teachers and their helpers who provided materials for these projects.

#### OTHER ACTIVITIES

Honeywell Arts and Entertainment will have an information table in the lobby near the box office with information about their youth summer camps for Summer Theater and Visual Art. Be sure to stop and inquire about the classes that will be offered to students from kindergarten through high school. We are an arts-enriched community with these summer activities that have a long legacy for Wabash County students.

#### WABASH VALLEY DANCE THEATER

The WVDT Company performers will perform the Greek dance Sirtaki during the Spotlight Closing Concert in Ford Theater at 3:00. This is probably the best-known of the Greek dances. Of Greek origin, it was choreographed for the 1964 film, Zorba the Greek. The dance and music were created by Mikis Theodorakis and is also called the Zorba dance.

The sirtaki is generally done in a line and sometimes in a circle, with a leader at the end. Danc-

ers perform the steps together by placing their hands on the shoulders of the dancers next to them. The steps are very slow at first, and as the music speeds up, the steps become faster and more rhythmic. As the enthusiasm builds, one might hear, "Opa!", an expression of joy or cheer (similar to Hooray!)

Dancing has held a very important position in Greek society throughout the centuries. Terpsichore, one of the 9 muses in Greek mythology, also known as the god of dance and lyric poetry, would be proud of these dancers.

#### DANCERS FROM WABASH AREA COMMUNITY THEATER

Andrea Lanham, Choreographer



Dancers from Wabash Area Community Theater, led by choreographer Andrea Lanham, will perform a Hopa, Hopa dance from Albania. The dance uses step hop patterns forward and back, side to side, and step patterns like the grapevine used in our dances. This circle dance is performed in other Balkan countries, including Ro-

mania and Croatia. We will likely see similarities between this dance and the sirtaki Greek dance.

Andrea Lanham has taught with Playhouse School of Dance in Marion and Wabash. She has been choreographer for the Wabash Area Community Theater's musical productions for the last several years. Today she will be joined by some of the WACT performers to share this dance demonstration.
